
PRESERVING OUR HOME

Honoring Chuck Fraser '76

How honored we are to have **Dr. Charles "Chuck" Fraser '76** as our speaker for this year's Pig Dinner on April 30! Raised in Midland, Chuck is a Texas Fiji and a member of UT's varsity tennis team. He currently serves as the medical director and surgeon of the Texas Center for Pediatric and Congenital Heart Disease at Dell Children's Medical Center.

Dr. Fraser was always a rising star in the medical profession. In 2002, his team developed the first pediatric lung-transplant program, which grew to become the largest in the nation; in 2005, he performed the first successful pediatric heart/lung transplant in the Southwest; by 2011, he was the surgeon-in-chief of Texas Children's Hospital. He has saved countless lives!

In 2018, Dr. Fraser was recruited to the University of Texas to develop an integrated center focused on pediatric and congenital cardiac care. He has published over 300 journal articles, chapters, and textbooks in medical literature and has performed over 18,000 congenital cardiac repair surgeries in children.

It has been an honor and privilege to serve as the president of Texas Fiji for the 2021-22 academic year. Since last April, it has been an eventful past 12 months, and I am grateful to have had such an amazing team helping me along the way. Our Chapter is very proud to share that we continued our push for community service and involvement on campus, and we have some exciting new projects as well.

Texas Fiji had a successful year with our community service and philanthropy initiatives. We raised over \$23,000 for the B+ Foundation and over \$10,000 for Hurricane Ida relief efforts. Brothers continued volunteering at the Food Bank, Habitat for Humanity, and the Feed My People initiative at the United Methodist Church.
